- 1. Build a new dormitory for girls at Act High School. \$45,000.

Why the Rakai District of Uganda?

The Rakai district of Uganda is ground zero for AIDS. Since the disease was discovered in Rakai in 1982, more than a million people have died, leaving behind more than 1.2 million orphans. In Uganda, HIV/AIDS has significantly reduced life expectancy, depleted the labor force and reduced food security. Many children are being raised by elderly relatives, and these children often have no choice but to work as laborers, rather than attend school. We need your help to change the lives of these children.


